

Abstract instructions

The abstract should be in Word-format and must not exceed one A4 page including references and contact e-mail. The abstract should, in the briefest terms possible, describe the topic, the scope, the principal findings, and the conclusions. It should be written to reflect accurately the content of the lecture or poster. The primary objective of an abstract is to communicate to the reader the essence of the presentation.

Heading, subheadings and text

- Heading/title should be in Calibri bold font size 14pt, centered
- Subheadings should be in Calibri bold font size 12pt, flush left
- Abstract text should be in Cambria, font size 12pt, flush left
- Margins shall be 2.5 cm
- One space between the title and the authors name
- Presenting authors name should be indicated with an asterisk (*)
- Addresses and e-mail to the presenter as a new line under the authors
- One space between the address and the abstract text
- One space before the list of references
- List the references according to Eur J Pharm Sci:
